Be One Person - Yourself

We live in a world that places huge premiums on how someone looks and, beyond that, how someone performs. It is an unfortunate reality of the time we live in that there seems to be very little focus on who a person really *IS*.

On June 1st, I underwent gastric bypass surgery. I am grateful for all the prayers, cards, visits, and support from my church family, friends, and immediate family. However, I believe some folks see the great benefit of this surgery as enhanced physical appearance. Actually, five or ten years ago, I would have felt the same way. For years, I have loathed and ridiculed my appearance. It was an embarrassment to me. Nevertheless, I wasn't willing to undergo surgery to look better. Then a funny thing happened on my way to becoming content with myself... I adopted Elena.

Parents all over the world will tell you that "everything changes" once you have a child. I had no problem believing that. What I didn't realize was that how I felt about myself would change. Initially, I quit worrying about my wrinkles, fat, style, makeup... all those outward appearances. However, what I began to worry about was health: spiritual health, emotional health, and physical health... both hers and mine.

I will be the first to tell you that I am very blessed with a healthy daughter. She constantly amazes me with her resiliency, her insights, and her compassion. I began to realize as she was growing up that her continued health, in many ways, depended on my health. It was at that point that I knew it was time to undergo "the knife." Surgery was no longer about looking good; it was about being healthy for my daughter.

In her book of devotions, Joyce Meyer talks about being content because she has become comfortable with who she is. She goes on to write, "People who long for their youth are never content, because every day that youth gets a little farther away. Don't despise getting old, because if you stay alive you can't avoid it. It's much better to enjoy who you are now and try to live and look appropriate for someone like you. It helps to find role models. We don't think of 50- or 60-year olds as needing role models, but they do! Everyone does.

Billy Graham is a good role model for me, and I can honestly say that I have never worried about how much he weighs or how many wrinkles he has. I admire him for his spirit. commitment, accomplishments, and dedication to God and his life's calling. Discontentment is one of the big giants we must conquer if we ever hope to enjoy life fully. Discontentment with looks, age, position, possessions, and anything else that makes us ungrateful for what we currently have.

We may not have all we would like to have, but we certainly have more than some people. No matter how you think you look, there is somebody who would love to look like you. No matter how old you are, there is someone older who would love to be as young as you. Love yourself and love your life; it it the only one you have!"

I would add to Ms. Meyer's thoughts that we are all children of God; he loves us just as we are... regardless of any flaws we have (or perceive ourselves to have). How can we not love what God loves. Be yourself. God only made one you, and that you has a purpose: to be yourself.

Meeting opened at 5:30 with prayer by Peg.

Treasurer's Report (Treasurer: Cindy Turner)

• Treasurer's report was received and approved as written. Cindy asked that she be replaced either as church secretary or as treasurer. She felt that the combined duties, along with changes in her personal life, had become too much to handle. She agreed to continue as treasurer for as long as she can. The Session agreed to begin looking for a replacement secretary.

Pastor Search

• Rev Liz Peterson has been offered the position of "Temporary Pastor" and Fred sent her a draft contract for review. We have not heard back from her, mainly because she has been at Montreat for the past two weeks and out of communication.

Ministry Team Reports

- Worship Committee Plans to have Hymn Service on July 12th. Forms are being included in the bulletin for the congregation to submit their favorite hymns to sing. The service will consist of scripture readings and a selection of hymns. Mimi will leaving for several weeks and we will need to find volunteer childcare while she is away. The congregation will also be canvassed for a new clerk of session. Peg pointed out that the clerk could be any elder and does not have to be someone currently on the Session. It was also pointed out that it is imperative that a new clerk of session be designated before the next Session meeting.
