# Prepare (or Arrange) Ye The Way



# **Picturing the Psalms**

The Rev. John Stuart, pastor of Erin Presbyterian Church in Knoxville, fills his free time with something he has done for as long as he can remember: art. But for the past two years he's been concentrating on a special project.

"I'm trying to create a drawing for each of the 150 Psalms in the Bible. As I read each Psalm, I ask God to help me choose the right verse in order to create a symbolic drawing."

Stuart began drawing the Psalms in November 2007. "When I first set out to complete the project, I thought it would only take me 150 nights. I was so wrong," he recalls. "I have completed Psalm 88, and I believe it will take about three years total to complete the project."

Stuart begins with a black crayon on white paper to draw his outline. He then scans the drawing using a Lexmark scanner and colors it in on the computer. "I call it digital glass," Stuart says. "I have sold several copies through the church to raise funds for an orphanage in Tanzania."

"This is my hobby, not a business. I want people to enjoy this style of art but I also want to send a message. I give them a verse and an image of that verse. I'm not throwing it (scripture) in their face but giving them something to think about. I hope that those who come across my picture Psalms will be drawn closer to God."

Stuart's artwork is on display through the end of September at Bear Creek Coffee house on Middlebrook Pike in West Knoxville. Its hours are 6:30 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday-Friday and 7:30 a.m.-6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Stuart's artwork is for sale at the coffeehouse.
